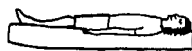
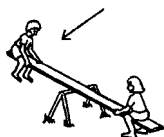

Auditory Activity No. 16 Transcript

You will need only one pencil today. Choose your favourite colour.

Today our words have 4 different ways to spell the [igh] sound. Remember the rules to help you know which letters to use in each word.

Point to each picture as I say the word for each one.

Listen carefully as I say the words again for you.

Now you are to decide which column each word belongs in.

Start with the first line and write the name for each picture in the correct column.

Do this with the other lines as well.

Group leader, press the pause button and then do this. When all 16 words have been written in the columns, press the button to continue.

Let's continue.

Words that rhyme do not always have the same spelling. Words that rhyme MUST have the same vowel SOUND and end with the same sound or sounds..... but the letters may sometimes be different.

Look at all the pictures again. Say the words to yourself. Find the ones that rhyme. Start with the first line. Circle the pictures for the 2 words that rhyme in the first line.

Now look at the next line. There are 2 more in this line that rhyme with the ones with circles around them in the first line. Circle these 2 pictures in the second line as well.

Continue the same way with the rest of the pictures. Put circles around the pictures that have words that rhyme with the ones already circled.

Put circles around the pictures on the rest of the page that have words that rhyme with the ones already circled.

When you have done that, you should have 9 circles.

Before we finish, ... how many of these words are verbs?

Look at the pictures, decide if the picture is showing an action for the word. If the word used for the picture is a verb, circle that word in the columns.

You will have five verbs circled.

Put your pencils down then as you have finished your work for today.
